Hazard Grant Pay Program Update

I was disappointed that the recent Hazard Grant Pay program didn't award any funding to any EMS agencies. In the course of their daily duties, our EMS workers are at significant risk of exposure to COVID-19 through one-on-one contact with the individuals who they provide lifesaving care to. They are the very definition of frontline workers.

My @PASenateDem colleagues and I sent a <u>letter</u> to @GovernorWolf urging him to appropriate additional CARES Act funding to the Hazard Pay Grants Program and to make a portion of that money available to EMS frontline workers. We need to provide support to these workers who provide such critical services to our entire community.

We write to urge you to join us in our push for additional funding for Hazard Pay Grants for frontline workers.

As you are aware, our caucus laid out a proposal to spend the Commonwealth's CARES Act funding in April. Our proposal included what was most important to our caucus: helping our frontline workers, small businesses and the healthcare industry. We were pleased that our efforts paid off and that many of our priorities were included in the May appropriation of some of the CARES Act funding.

Unfortunately, the needs far outpaced the funding that were made available. A prime example, the more than \$800 million in requests made for the \$50 million available for hazard pay grants to frontline workers. We understand the need to prioritize funding to those frontline workers who are most at risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Our caucus was disheartened to see that the awardee list did not include any EMS workers. In the course of their daily duties they cannot avoid direct, one-on-one contact with those individuals they are providing lifesaving care to. It is our belief that these workers are the very definition of frontline workers.

As we move into the fall legislative session and the deadline to spend CARES Act funding quickly

approaches, we believe that we should appropriate additional funding for Hazard Pay Grants and that a portion of that money should be made available to EMS frontline workers.

We know hazard pay is as important to you as it is to members of our caucus. Our caucus has forcefully pushed the United States Senate to pass the Heroes Act which includes \$190 billion for hazard pay.

While we await additional resources from the Federal Government, we believe we should appropriate additional CARES Act funding for the Commonwealth's Hazard Pay Grant Program.

Pennsylvania Approved for Extra \$300 Per Week to Eligible Unemployed Workers



The Department of Labor & Industry (L&I) Secretary Jerry Oleksiak announced on August 25, 2020 that Pennsylvania will get nearly \$1.5 billion to provide an extra \$300 per week to eligible unemployed workers through the temporary federal Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) program, administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Payments will be made to eligible claimants retroactively from August 1, 2020. The grant will provide the extra \$300 weekly payment until the FEMA funding is exhausted, the federal government enacts a new law, or extends the recently ended Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation

program. LWA will run for a minimum of three weeks and will end no later than December 27, 2020. You can read the complete press release <u>here</u>.

PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE

GROUPS WHO SHOULD NOT FILE FOR PUA

PUA is <u>only</u> for individuals who are unemployed due to COVID-19 reasons and does not cover individuals without an attachment to the labor market or those who are unemployed for non-COVID-19 reasons. This benefit is only for individuals who would otherwise be working but are unable to because of the current pandemic.

The following are some of the groups who should NOT file for PUA.


backpack themes:
