## News from Lindsey Williams about PA Senate Activity

Many people don't realize that current Senate rules allow the Majority Party to completely control which bills receive a vote at all, as well as the timetable for those votes. These rules prevent even common sense, bipartisan legislation from ever receiving a vote in Committee or on the floor. For example, last session I co-sponsored Victoria's Law, legislation that would ban the sale of pets from puppy mills. Despite this legislation having co-sponsors on both sides of the aisle, it was never even voted on in committee.

And on the other hand, if the Majority Party supports legislation, it can force a floor vote on short notice, giving legislators little time to review the full language of the bill or to seek input from constituents and stakeholders. This should not be the way we legislate. That's why I do not vote in favor of any legislation I haven't been given proper notice or time to read thoroughly.

I proposed these [rules](#) because I am tired of telling my constituents that I can't do anything to move legislation that matters so much to you. A healthy democracy should give both parties a voice.



On another front, also during the first day of session, the Majority Party, led by President Pro Tempore Jake Corman, refused to seat Senator Jim Brewster, who won his election and was certified by the Secretary of State, citing a petition filed in the Senate by Senator Brewster's opponent. The precedent set by Senator Corman last week is worrisome-- the majority can refuse to seat a duly elected Senator simply because their opponent objects to it. While I am relieved to report that Senator Brewster was sworn in on Wednesday, January 13, this unnecessarily left the constituents of the 45th Senatorial District without representation for over a week.

As many of you know, the Senate Republicans threatened not to seat me after I won my election. But I came to Harrisburg to represent the voices of all of my constituents. And I will fight suppression of your voices, whether that suppression comes at the ballot box or in the Senate chamber.

**Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry resumes the Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) program. Extra \$300 payments started January 12, 2021.**

Regular unemployment recipients now automatically receive an extra \$300 FPUC payment per week in addition to their unemployment payments for claim weeks ending January 2, 2021 through March 13, 2021. The FPUC program was reinstated as part of the federal stimulus that Congress passed last month.

**PUA and PEUC Programs temporarily suspended as of December 26, 2020. L&I awaits federal Cares Act extension guidelines.**

Pennsylvania Labor and Industry will restart Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) and Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) programs soon. L&I requires federal CARES Act extension guidance from the US Department of Labor to ensure it follows the law. When payments resume, the department will backdate eligible claims to the week of Jan. 2 and add on the FPUC payments to ensure claimants do not miss any eligible
