Last week, the Senate passed SB1246 that would allow the Governor to bestow law enforcement officers with various medals of honor. I believe that all of our brave first responders deserve the same opportunity to be granted this honor, which is why I introduced SB1369 this week. My bill will expand the medals of honor program under SB1246 to firefighters, EMS, fire-police, and 911 Dispatchers.


